Information and Referral

Access II maintains a comprehensive resource library of both written and video materials on a wide variety of disability related subjects. We also have resources at the regional, state and national level.

- Peer Counseling**
Staff and trained volunteers work with others with similar disabilities to explore problem-solving strategies in overcoming barriers in their lives.
- Advocacy**
Access II provides two kinds of advocacy: (1) Individual Advocacy – We assist and educate individuals to become self advocates against discrimination, (2) Systemic Advocacy – We participate in activities to make changes in the community, the state, and the nation allowing persons with disabilities to live more independently.
- Independent Living Skills Training**
Access II provides training to help people with disabilities gain skills that would enable them to live more independently.

Their mission statement is as follows:

“The mission of Access II ILC is to provide programs and services that encourage and help sustain greater independence for persons with disabilities within our communities.”

Our disabled individuals are the largest minority in the world. We are grateful of these services of Access II for those individuals. It just makes the world a better place to live.
