

**July Program Chairman, Ron Brohammer** introduced his guest speaker for the day. The Richmond Recreation Director, Haley Morrissey. Ron gave a glowing report on the very fine job that Haley is doing with the City's Recreation Programs. Her presentation was proof of her dedication to her job.

Haley started off by handing out her 16 page summation of the City Recreation Department mission and a very detailed listing of 22 activities. That listing included pictures and the main information needed to understand the activities that are offered and necessary information for you to have few or no questions about what is being done and how to get involved in the recreation program which is a whole lot more than just summer leagues of the major sports.
