Terry has been under contract with the City of Richmond for 3 years. Terry works with several community organizations such as the Richmond Downtown Development Committee. That committee was formed with the goal of re-developing our downtown district. He itemized about five other organizations that he works with all with the purpose of making Richmond a better place to live and work. Terry is our connection with the Kansas City Area Development Council. Our efforts of economic Development have been, so far been paid for by the Richmond Economic Development, Inc. (REDI).
