The City Council is made up of 8 council members, 2 from each ward. There are eight departments including: Fire, Finance, Collector, Human Resource, Community Development, Municipal Court, Public Works and Recreation.

The City operates on a seven million dollar budget for the population of 5,797. The annual payroll is \$2.6. Many improvements have been made and those include: Street overlay, Sludge clean out of one holding "tank". Re-lined about 7,000 ft of sewer line.
