Juanita Hughes of Ray County Probation and Parole, Program for today, June 19th. Our Program Chairman for June, Deputy Brian Bush invited our speaker to talk about her job with Probation and Parole. Juanita has been with the department for 22 years now. There are 43 P & P districts in the state of Missouri. Our district is made up of Ray, Clay and Platte Counties. Her job is to enforce the requirements of the Court. (In Ray County probation and parole that would be Judge Miller). In the entire state of Missouri there are about 18,000 parolees and another 75,000 probationary individuals that are required to report to their local probation and parole authority such as Juanita's district. She says the oldest person she has had as a "client" was 82 years of age and of course the youngest is 17. Much of her assistance comes from the presence of the Tri-County Mental Health tax to support many of the expenses that are not covered by fees assessed to the "client" that she is working with to get them back on the "straight and narrow".
