Program Chair for June, JoEllen Dale, introduced our guest speaker of the day, Paul Teegarden. Paul's topic was the Ray County Baseball Association. He serves as the president of that organization that involves 36 players in 3 age groups which with a little math equals only 12 members in each age group.

The Ray County Baseball Association is a not-profit organization. They play on the field just south of Hwy. 10 in a park created by the city and school. They have spent a lot of time improving the ball park with no lighting. They have renovated the fence going to a chain-link fence, renovated the bathrooms. These are two of the many improvements made. Next year it will cost a player, \$400 a year which pays for his uniform and tournament entry fees. If a child can't afford the fee they do all they can to find financial assistance. They have 3 major sponsors: Richmond Farm and Lawn, Pearson Real Estate and Arnett Enterprises. The team age groups are 12 and under, 10 and under and 8 and under. Most of their games are played at Fountain Bluff just off hwy. 210/291.
